6. Progress towards Federation Development Plans 2022/23 (the following is just a summary of some of the key points):

Federation wide priority:

- To maximise the benefits of the Federation model for all stakeholders:
 - moving to a single federation budget
 - o improvements in the arrangements for transition from year 2 to 3

- subject leaders have begun working together and have created curriculum journeys from reception to year 6
- o agreed a single federation uniform to be in place for September 2024
- a new federation logo to be used from September 2023 \a reviewed set of federation values and a new federation vision that will be launched in September 2023
- new staff recruited on federation employment contracts to allow for flexibility to address need across the federation

Carlisle Infant School priorities:

- To ensure gaps in reading and phonics are closed to support our aim for every child to leave Carlisle as a reader:
 - Little Wandle phonics programme introduced across the school and teaching and support staff given full cpd and support to be able to deliver the programme with consistency and confidence.
- To improve outcomes in writing for all pupil groups through developing staff subject knowledge:
 - Significant progress in this area and strong subject leadership has been developed partly through participation in a borough writing project.
- To continue to develop the impact of leaders at all levels to improve pupil outcomes:
 - Good progress in this area which was evidenced by an external review in Summer 23 and deep dives into Phonics, Early Reading, Maths, History.
- To further develop our nurturing provision to support the mental health and wellbeing needs of the children, staff and families:
 - Significant progress in this area:
 - Whole school review led to a review of the behaviour policy and the introduction of new strategies that are being used consistently throughout the school creating a calm, orderly environment where children learn best.
 - The school works well with outside organisations to support children where necessary

The school achieved the Attachment Aware Silver Award.

Hampton Hill Junior School priorities:

- To continue to make improvements to the quality of education provided with a focus on writing and pupils who are experiencing disadvantage:
 - There has been improvement in this area and the writing lead has been part of a borough wide writing project.
 - Writing will remain a whole school focus.
- To ensure that school leaders continue to impact positively on the quality of teaching and learning:
 - Lots of progress in this area and subject leaders now have regular dedicated time to carry out subject leader activities to support teachers as necessary.
 - Some subject leaders are working with other schools and the wider borough
- To ensure our routines and expectations support all pupils to consistently make positive behaviour choices
 - Consistent language and routines have supported children to enjoy school and feel safe.
 - The Silver Attachment Aware Award was achieved.
- To ensure ongoing support for the personal development of all pupils at HHJS
 - Positive progress has been enhanced by clear and inclusive messaging, pupil voice and leadership and a wide range of additional opportunities.
